Jennifer and her co-author, Amy Richards, were on campus last week as this year's Center for Women and Gender Visionaries in Residence. FIVE JOIN D-GALA BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Five alums joined D-GALA's Board of Directors this year. The five are Sarah Burgamy '00, Nick Chamousis '73, Jim Flahive '01, Jamie Kershaw '89, and James von Rittmann '95.

Sarah '00 (photo not available at press time) was co-chair of the Dartmouth Rainbow Alliance during her time on campus. A 4-year varsity swimmer and member of the Women's Rugby Club, Sarah worked to bridge gaps between "athletic" and "non-athletic" LGBT students. Now back in her home state of Colorado, Sarah is pursuing graduate work in psychology at the University of Denver and working as a student therapist at the GLBT Community Center of Colorado. Sarah has been encouraged by the greater acceptance of LGBT students at Dartmouth since her graduation, and she looks forward to continuing to support Dartmouth's LGBT communities through her work with D-GALA.

Nick '73 is rejoining the D-GALA Board for his second term, having served in the mid-1990s. Nick has his own law practice in Manhattan, is a charter member of Out Professionals, the nation's largest LGBT professional organization, and is a volunteer tutor at the Harvey Milk High School for LGBT students. Nick has been acting as D-GALA's liaison to the Dartmouth Club of New York City and looks forward to working with young alums who are facing many of the issues that Nick has faced in forging a life after Dartmouth.



Jim '01, who attended a small parochial high school in western Massachusetts before Dartmouth, slowly came out at Dartmouth. He found the Questioning and Curious program to be invaluable in that difficult process. Through the support of many at Dartmouth, Jim reports that he was able to leave college as a well-adjusted and proud openly



gay person. Jim, who is openly gay (apparently the first) at his suburban Washington, D. C. software development firm, is involved with several gay community organizations in D.C., including the Human Rights Campaign. On the D-GALA Board, Jim hopes to help to forge greater ties between the Dartmouth LGBT community and national and local LGBT organizations. The Board's most recent grad, Jim also plans to work to increase outreach to current and recent Dartmouth graduates.

Jamie '89 is an attorney in business and legal affairs at Dreamworks in Los Angeles, where he served for four years on the board of Outfest, LA's, LGBT film festival. When Jamie was able recently to make his contribution to the Dartmouth College Fund using D-GALA's form, he "realized how far the College has come regarding issues of sexual orientation since I graduated." In joining the Board, Jamie hopes to help continue D-GALA's efforts "to make the Dartmouth experience for gay and lesbian students better as well as increase the visibility of gay and lesbian alumni in the overall alum population."



James '95 is a graduate student at Stanford in both Organizational Behavior and Engineering. He is Treasurer of the Dartmouth Alumni Association of Silicon Valley, and is now joining the D-GALA Board to bring his enthusiasm for Dartmouth service to the College's LGBT community.



These five new directors take the places of retiring directors Stephen Coppola '83, Dottie Foley '86, Steve James-Hermann '80, Yuval Ortiz-Quiroga '02 and Eric Stults '80. All five provided dedicated service to D-GALA during their terms, which in the cases of Steve and Eric have extended since D-GALA was reconstituted in 1994. D-GALA is sponsoring/co-sponsoring various **events during C&R Week in June**, including open houses at the new LGBT Student Center in Robinson 107-109 on Monday, June 14th and Friday June 18th from 3 to 5 PM; D-GALA's traditional breakfast meeting and reception in the Faculty Lounge upstairs in the Hop on Saturday, June 19th at 8:30 AM (where we expect a visit from President Jim Wright, among others); and a reception for all affiliated alumni groups at the Latin American, Latino, Caribbean Student House on North Main Street from 4-6 PM on Saturday the 19th. We hope to see you there!

Updating the Alumni Association vote profiled in the November 2003 *Green Light*, despite the valiant efforts of D-GALA and BADA (Black Alumni of Dartmouth Association) who, among other get-out-the-vote efforts, co-sponsored a bus to Hanover from New York City, the proposed new Constitution for the Alumni Council and Alumni Association missed the required $\frac{3}{4}$ vote by just 9 votes. Attendance at the December 6, 2003 meeting was hampered by an early-season blizzard that struck the Northeast, keeping some D-GALA voters away. The new Constitution would have given D-GALA and other affiliated alumni groups 2 seats on a revamped Alumni Council. The Council and the Association are now considering a new proposed Constitution, and D-GALA Alumni Council Rep Trevor Burgess '94 is on the new study committee.

D-GALA President David Eichman '82 attended the annual Club and Affiliated Group Officers Weekend in Hanover in late March (when more snow fell!). David reports that D-GALA clubs in at least 8 regions or cities are **interested in co-sponsoring events with local D-GALA members**. At the March Club and Affiliated Group weekend, the College presented D-GALA with the first ever **Affiliated Group of the Year Award**. D-GALA was recognized for reaching out to alums and helping them to reconnect with Dartmouth and for co-partnering with the Dartmouth College Fund to increase the participation of D-GALA members.

Dartmouth has supported D-GALA this year by funding a **full page color ad in the May/June Dartmouth Alumni Magazine** and by **contributing \$2,000 to D-GALA's second all-class reunion (October 1-3, 2004)**. The ad is on page 11 of the Alumni Magazine. We can support the College and enhance D-GALA's voice by supporting the Dartmouth College Fund. All D-GALA contributions this fiscal year (by June 30, 2004) will be recognized at the All-Class Reunion with the presentation of the traditional large "check" to the College.
